Job Summary	The Outreach Worker participates directly in the provision of services, resolves difficult or sensitive issues or problems and maintains a welcoming environment for a diverse homeless population, including people with mental or physical disabilities, people with addictions, women and aboriginal people.	
Duties and Responsibilities	 Under the direction of the Outreach Manager, Team Lead or Outreach Team: Acts as an advocate on behalf of family members, working for rightful justice and fair treatment, taking appropriate action to assist. Monitors computer lab, hygiene area, drop-in floor, courtyard and bathrooms. Maintains open lines of communication between various areas of OPS. Maintains a professional yet compassionate relationship with family members. Ensures program delivery is consistent with the OPS vision. Summer position may have a specific project assignment as directed by the Manager. Cross training in housing may be available.
