ith the holiday season upon us, I've been thinking about what happens when people move together in kindness—like a flock of starlings, thousands of individual movements that, together, create something breathtaking. No single bird leads, and yet the whole sky changes shape.

That's what community looks like when we each respond to the needs of those around us with generosity.

Right now, here in Greater Victoria, the need is immense. People are cold, hungry, and scared. Rents are out of reach. Shelters are full. Families are hanging on by a thread. At Our Place, we see this every day—and we also see hope, compassion, and courage.

But we can't help alone. It is only because of you.

More than 97% of our donations are under \$100. That means nearly every meal we serve, every shower we offer, every bed we provide, every recovery program we run—is made possible by people who gave what they could. People who may have wondered if their donation was too small to matter. It isn't. It never has been. It never could be.

Every single dollar helps someone move one step closer-from surviving to thriving. From a hot meal to a safe bed. From despair to dignity.

I often hear people say, "There's just so much need so many problems. How can one person, or one small donation, make a difference?" The truth is, it's the only thing that ever has. Every great change starts with one person choosing compassion over despair, and generosity over fear.

And for those receiving help? As someone at Our Place recently told me, "Even if a donation only helped one person-this place saved my life."

It's the season of giving, and the multiplier effect of every act of generosity is enormous. We see this ripple effect every day at Our Place, and this holiday, you can create it with your gift. One mom who comes in for a meal finds the strength to finish her shift and pay her rent. Her child sleeps in a warm bed that night, goes to school rested, and starts to believe that life can be safe again. That's not a small thing. That's how cycles of despair begin to turn into cycles of hope. That's how generational change begins—quietly, sometimes invisibly, one act of care at a time.

It's hard to measure that kind of impact. It doesn't fit neatly into a chart or a spreadsheet. But it is real. It's happening right here, because people like you refuse to look away and instead lean in with kindness.
